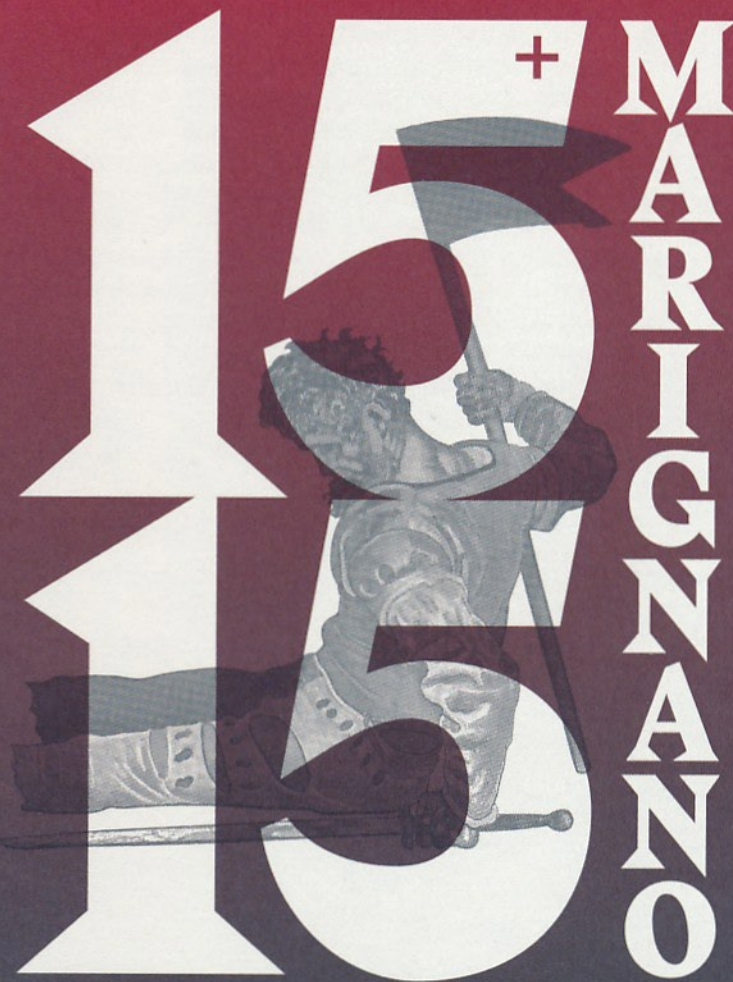

The sound of drum rolls and bugle calls, and the thundering of French artillery: 500 years after the "Battle of Giants", the exhibition entitled "1515 Marignano" explores the causes and consequences of the wars surrounding Milan. The wide array of objects on display depict Switzerland in its role as a military power and

provider of mercenary forces. France, Switzerland's adversary, and Milan, the focus of the discord, are also featured in the exhibition.

What were people fighting for 500 years ago in the Battle of Marignano? What events led up to the Battle at Marignano in late summer of 1515? Why did the Swiss lose against France? And whom did Switzerland's mercenaries go on to serve next? "1515 Marignano" reconstructs the events leading to the battle and also looks beyond them. The splendour of the papal gifts of 1512 illuminates Switzerland as a military power. An audiovisual installation brings to life the full force of the battle, which claimed more than 10 000 casualties, most of whom came from Switzerland. The peace agreement of 1516, with its 19 magnificent seals, is evidence, however, of the profitable peace that came about for Switzerland.
